Some census tracts straddle city boundaries. If the majority of the population in such tracts is inside the city, the total population for the census tract is considered to be inside the city.

CDPs are Census Designated Places. These are places delineated to provide data for settled concentrations of population that are identifiable by name but are not legally incorporated under the laws of the state in which they are located.
