A CIVIL RIGHTS VOTING RECORD

FOR THE

93rd CONGRESS: 1973-1974

SENATE ISSUES

1. **IMPOUNDMENT** - A crucial issue at the start of this Congress was President Nixon's attempt to kill or weaken social programs he did not like by impounding funds Congress had appropriated for them. On May 10, 1973, the Senate approved a limitation on his impoundment powers by vote of 66-to-24. A vote FOR is Right; a vote AGAINST is Wrong.
2. **POSTCARD VOTER REGISTRATION** - A bill setting up a national system of registration by postcard to make it simpler for potential voters to register for federal elections was temporarily blocked in the Senate by a filibuster. The filibuster was finally broken on May 9, 1973 by a cloture vote of 67-to-32. A vote FOR Cloture is right; a vote AGAINST Cloture is Wrong.
3. **MINIMUM WAGE** - Senators Peter Dominick (R., Colo.) and Robert Taft (R., Ohio), sought to weaken the bill by offering a substitute that would stretch-out the wage raise, limit coverage and impose a sub-minimum rate for youth. Their substitute was rejected on July 18, 1973, by a vote of 57-to-40. A vote FOR is Wrong; a vote AGAINST is Right.
4. **GENOCIDE CONVENTION** - An attempt to get the Senate to ratify, after 25 years, the U.N. Convention outlawing the crime of Genocide, was blocked by a filibuster. Two attempts to invoke cloture failed. The second and last attempt, on February 6, 1974 was 55-to-38, seven short of the necessary two-thirds vote. A vote FOR Cloture is Right; a vote AGAINST is Wrong.
5. **D.C. HOME RULE** - After nearly 100 years without self-government, this Congress gave the citizens of the District of Columbia limited homerule: mainly the right to elect a mayor and city council. On December 19, 1973, the Senate adopted the Conference report on the bill by a vote of 77-to-13. A vote FOR is Right; a vote AGAINST is Wrong.

A CIVIL RIGHTS VOTING RECORD

93rd CONGRESS: 1973-74

HOUSE ISSUES

1. IMPOUNDMENT - A crucial issue before this Congress was President Nixon's use of impoundment to withhold funds from social programs of which he disapproved. By a vote of 254-163 on July 25, 1973, the House approved a limitation of Presidential impoundment power. A vote FOR is RIGHT; A vote AGAINST is WRONG.

2. MINIMUM WAGE

(a) Representative John Erlenborn (R) of Illinois submitted a weakening amendment that would limit coverage and establish a youth subminimum wage. It was defeated on June 6, 1973 by a vote of 218-199. A vote FOR is WRONG; A vote AGAINST is RIGHT.

(b) The House failed to override President Nixon's veto of the Minimum Wage Bill on September 19, 1973, by a vote of 259-164. A vote FOR is RIGHT; A vote AGAINST is WRONG.

3. ELEMENTARY and SECONDARY EDUCATION ACT

(a) Representative John Ashbrook (R) of Ohio introduced an amendment on March 27, 1974, that would impose a ban on use of Federal funds for busing to overcome racial imbalance in schools. The amendment was accepted by a vote of 239-168. A vote FOR is WRONG; a vote AGAINST is RIGHT.

(b) Representative Marvin Esch (R) of Michigan introduced a substitute amendment that would limit busing for desegregation and permit reopening of settled desegregation cases. The House voted to accept this amendment by a vote of 293-117, on March 26, 1974. A vote FOR is WRONG; a vote AGAINST is RIGHT.

4. COMMUNITY SERVICES - An amendment by Representative Jack Kemp (R) of New York would have shifted control of community action programs to the States. The amendment was rejected by a vote of 264-122, on May 29, 1974. A vote FOR is WRONG; a vote AGAINST is RIGHT.

5. POSTCARD VOTER REGISTRATION - House consideration of the bill to establish a national system of postcard voter registration for all federal elections was blocked when opponents succeeded in defeating the rule. The House never got to vote on the bill itself. The rule was defeated by a vote of 197-204, on May 8, 1974. A vote FOR is RIGHT; a vote AGAINST is WRONG.
6. LABOR-HEW APPROPRIATION - Representative John Ashbrock (R) of Ohio introduced an amendment that would prevent use of Federal funds for school desegregation purposes. The House accepted amendment by a vote of 231-137 on June 28, 1974. A vote FOR is WRONG; a vote AGAINST is RIGHT.
7. HOME RULE FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA - Representative Earl Landgrebe (R) of Indiana introduced a motion to recommit the Home Rule bill to the Conference Committee on December 17, 1973. By a vote of 259-80, the motion was defeated. A vote FOR is WRONG; a vote AGAINST is RIGHT.
8. SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION BILL 1975 - Representative Marjorie Holt (R) of Maryland introduced an amendment that would block HEW efforts to get public schools to end discrimination based on race, religion, sex, or national origin. The House accepted the amendment October 1, 1974, by a vote of 220-169. A vote FOR is WRONG; a vote AGAINST is RIGHT.
